


The First Grade Forecast

The majority of students feel cozy in their bed under lots of blankets. Students have listened to many stories that use the word cozy. The word cozy has been added to our vocabulary notebooks.

In Math we continue learning about time. In addition to learning about telling time on a clock, we have learned about telling time in days of the week and months of the year. We will test on this concept next week and move on to counting patterns to 100 and graphing.

During social studies this week we began learning about the Polar Regions. We located the Arctic and learned about the climate. We learned that their winter is 6 months long and their summer climate averages 50 degrees. We learned about some of the animals found in the Arctic. Next week we will learn about the Antarctic.
